To assess the level at witch country contributed to the Firenze 2006 Wonca Europe meeting in term of communications


Method


We took the official program and counted the number of oral presentations and posters allocated to each country


Results

57 countries from 5 continents


1,112 communications: 624 oral presentations and 488 posters The first 16 countries represented 80 % of overall presentations the first 15 made 80 % of oral presentations and the first 11 made 80 % of posters.






Discussion

- Heavy impact from countries (Italia, Spain, Greece and Turkey)
- Lower representation from countries where general practice is well recognised (UK, Netherlands)
- Emergence of new EU countries (Bosnia, Poland, Slovenia)
- Non negligible contribution form countries outside of Europe (70 oral communications and 50 posters, 10% of total amount of communications)

This results are quite surprising. Are they due to search of recognition with international meeting participation?

Limit: some presentations were made by doctors from different countries, but we took the country indicate for each presentation in the book of abstracts. Italia had an important impact, maybe because she hosted the meeting.

Conclusion

Those results show the impressive impact of southern Europe with 50% of presentations from 4 countries (Italy, Spain, Greece and Turkey) and a good participation of "new EU" countries with 3 countries in the first 12 (Bosnia, Poland and Slovenia).and a good participation of "new EU" countries with 3 countries in the first 12 (Bosnia, Poland and Slovenia).
